# **Group Visioning Activities**

## **Vision Gallery**

- Select a topic or project, specific or general.

-Questions about that topic or project can be brainstormed as a group or assigned.

-For 15-20 minutes, individuals spend time alone, sketching their personal visions by writing, outlining, diagramming or drawing.

-The next 20 minutes are spent in small clusters of 3-5 people, pooling their visions and expressing a common one on a large sheet of paper.

- Each small group posts their composite on the wall with others'. The whole group can then evaluate and discuss the results.

Consider - Where are the areas of agreement? What needs the most work?

#### Vision statement

Description: For 10-15 minutes individuals spend time alone writing one or two statements of vision about what their ideal community will look like.

-Individuals join in groups of two to merger their vision statements.

-Groups of two join to form groups of four and continue to blend their visions.

-This continues until the whole group is together.

### Letter to Myself

Description: Individuals spend 20-30 minutes writing a letter to themselves six months or one year in the future, describing how they feel about the community and what the group will have become.

- Read portions of the letter aloud to the group

- Put the letters in a 'mailbox' and save them to read in six months

## **Identifying boundaries**

Description: Each person creates a chart with three columns. In relation to the project, fill in the following categories.

1) Things you must have for yourself

2) Things you are willing to share

3) Things you are willing to give up

List people's thoughts on a large chart and discuss.

## **Group Story**

Description: Envision the group in the future, established and successful. Brainstorm things that people feel will be an essential part of a successful group.

-List these items on newsprint

-Have one person start to tell a story about a typical day in the community or an adventure the community will have.

-After a few minutes have someone else in the group continue the story.

-Try to use words and images from the brainstormed list as you tell the story.
